IN THE FACE OF ART

FOUR PORTRAITS. FOUR INSPIRING STORIES

Human faces are endlessly fascinating, spawning an enormously diverse range of approaches and techniques for depicting them. Whether a portrait uses photography, painting, or mixed media, the result is always something unique, new, and beautiful. The subject should be illuminated in the picture, depicted by their face, expression, or inimitable eyes. A good portrait always generates its own visual vocabulary. Reading it and receiving its sensory messages are what makes the encounter so alluring.

Belgian fashion photographer **Gaetan Caputo** fully understands the tried and true formula of *less is more*, which helps him reveal a higher dialog. He combines simple contrasts in a convincing way to create brilliant, new fashion portraits. Severe angles versus natural, curving lines; black against white – in his portrait of a modern Cleopatra, avant-garde meets antiquity. Everything is elegantly planned down to the last detail, then precisely and beautifully executed. The contrasts in the image and its contents are extreme. This elevates Caputo's

picture to a complexly stylized feat in which a slew of art history and aesthetic references interweave to form a topological puzzle of styles.

Canadian artist **André Monet**, on the other hand, puts contemporary icons at the center of his multifaceted portrait collages. He reflects on the subjects using a technique based on quotation. Everything in his pieces originates from materials

directly related to the subject. The manner in which he combines and arranges these materials adds a new dimension to the portrait, a likeness of the painter Pablo Picasso in this case. Everything – images, texts, newspaper clippings, pieces of maps, and more – is visually and contextually related. The collage materials playfully illuminate the subject of the portrait in a previously unseen way.

The streets of New York are full of people and contrasts. Among the masses, the individual disappears under the weight of the collective. That makes it so much more thrilling when New York street photographer **Joseph Cela** is able to capture and present individuals in images he composes in the blink of an eye. Incorporating the city's advertisements into the dialog, he succeeds in creating narrative scenes which illustrate the individual diversity of life in the city. Without realizing it, passersby interact with giant, artificial images. The external and internal worlds meld into eloquent images. The oversized faces on the streets appear as if they are observing – and commenting on – what is happening around them.

Art duo **Andrey Yakovlev and Lili Aleeva** are known for their extraordinary photographic compositions that are more than fashion portraits. In their work, the image is elevated to a stylistic reinterpretation of famous art imagery. The image *The Triumph of Form* emulates the work of the avant-garde Polish artist Tamara de Lempicka, whose work in the 1920s brought the portrait genre into the Art Deco scene. What makes Yakovlev & Aleeva's picture so special is the execution. Although it is entirely photographic, they create the appearance of a painting. It functions as a portrait in two ways: firstly, in the sense of fashion and its enchanting forms. And secondly, it is a portrait of a previous time and era in art, made in the style of one of the period's most extravagant artists.

THE ART OF DECEPTION

PAINTERLY PHOTOGRAPHS BY SABINE DEHNEL

Berlin-based artist **Sabine Dehnel** has roots in painting, but has also worked with sculpture and photography for quite some time. Her visual vocabulary is noticeably similar across these disciplines. While her painting is very physical, her photography is very painterly. And in her sculpture, we encouter both of these visual languages combined. In this spirit, her portrait inhabits the space along the boundaries between multiple art forms. At the heart of this piece is a medallion featuring a portrait of artist Frida Kahlo. The wearer of the medallion, however, is a real, living person. The blouse created by the artist and the model's painted upper body form close correlations to Kahlo.

While the piece is executed to appear like a painting at first, it proves itself to be a perfectly staged and illuminated photograph.

A great photo cannot take itself. While shooting in India, Kai Stuht could fully rely on his team to assist in realizing his vision.

Renowned German photographer **Kai Stuht** has traveled through India multiple times. To him, the country has a very special aura that influences the atmosphere on set and makes a noticeable impact on the look of his pictures. Décor, details, colors, and textures are just as important to the artist as the focus and color density in the picture itself. For the latter considerations, the Panasonic Ambassador placed his trust in a Lumix S-1R in India, which gave him especially precise autofocus.

Stuht's gripping visions are always good for a stylistic surprise. They possess the elegance and deep beauty of walking through a dream. In India, the photographer once again found the perfect conditions for an energetic and inspiring shoot, resulting in a series of new pictures that beg us to stare and inspire us to dream.

A simple cube in the desert could be the first building block for a new megacity. Cities grow in every direction, conquering the heights and burrowing under the earth. A complex accumulation of diverse materials and variables occupies the space. With its ability to react quickly and adapt, the medium of photography was predestined to metropolitan space the metropolitan. But what is "metropolitan" exactly? A feeling? A mode of perception? Depending on the point of view, its meaning and form changes.

The "Prada Marfa" installation by artists Elmgreen & Dragset plays with the contrast of city and countryside using prefabricated templates. Far removed from every boulevard and a fashion-conscious customer base, the duo created a sealed showcase building for a famous Italian fashion label out in the middle of the Texas desert. It is a fully equipped display room space, but one that will never open its doors. Danish architectural photographer **Adam Mørk** turned his camera

to this obscure object in the best tradition of American color photography. After viewing the image for extended periods of time, the aspects that are confusing at first transition to become almost familiar. This is the image's strength. It plays with our expectations of reality and questions our perception of the metropolitan.

The power of the city, which often plays a role in representations of urban life, takes hold of us primarily when we approach it without reservations. Sometimes this intoxicating power can come over us like a visual hallucinogen, as it does in the luminous cityscapes by filmmaker and photographer **Xavier Portela**. With his camera, Portela captures the insomnia of big cities. His pictures are powerful and dynamic, nearly split into nested sections. They are like nocturnal and lucid waking dreams. We see the city at night, but at the same time we recognize that light and frozen time are whipping through the streets of Hong Kong like an artificial comet tail.

With a change of perspective, urban space can show an entirely new face. See, for instance, **Navid Baraty's** strictly vertical photographs exploring spatial depth. From great heights, he shoots perfectly perpendicular to the earth, capturing carefully chosen city canyons below. With New York's reflective glass facades, the numerous lights and rooms in the office buildings, the streets, and the skyscrapers' vanishing lines, the big picture feels like an abstract, geometric tableau of urban reality. It is an expressive transformation, because the pictures show the city in a way that is more than astonishing. They reveal a beauty that is theoretically always present, but that has never been shown to us from this angle before.

At magic hour, a very special light falls on New York, and the city that never sleeps appears to be "resting its eyes" for a moment. The light tints the buildings and their facades with warm red tones. Dutch artist **Jack Marijnissen** captures this moment of serenity perfectly, creating a composition with the power of a contemplative experience. The lattice frame laid over top of the piece like muntin bars adds another dimension; it creates the impression that you are actually in a room looking through a window at one of the most fascinating cities in North America.

A city's indoor space is highly influenced by the expressiveness of its inhabitants. They are who give a city its unique flair and its cultural face. For over 12 years, German photographer **Werner Pawlok** has gained access to formerly grand Cuban villas. He has brought back a comprehensive monograph from these journeys into the private sphere. The Cubans' unique charm is really spotlighted in their colorful and unusually decorated rooms. The photographs show a reveling in memory, but at the same time, there is a desire for a new, purer presence.

By contrast, **Maurizio Galimberti** takes inspiration from the rhythm of the city, depicting it in a mosaic of photographs of certain significant characteristics. In the picture "Yellow Dance," he deconstructs a New York street scene from top to bottom and uses the different individual images to compose an immensely impressive dance. On the surface, the mosaic itself appears like a sketch of the city in which the vibrations and noise of New York are visually inscribed and rhythmically composed.



His collection of artworks, *The Salt Series*, is a maximum resolution look at salt ponds. In these large-format pictures, the bodies of water almost appear to be painted with very fine brushstrokes. Bacterial cultures, which feel right at home in high-salinity evaporation ponds, conjure up the expressive red hues.





YELLOWTAIL MACKEREL SASHIMI (SERVES FOUR)

4 x 100g yellowtail mackerel filet, thinly sliced

ELDERBERRY SAUCE

60ml Elderberry syrup

30ml lemon juice

30ml lime juice

40ml rice vinegar

Stir ingredients, add cold thickening agent

ONION CRÈME

100g white onions cut in strips

50g shallots, cut into very thin strips

20g garlic, peeled and finely minced

4tbsp clarified butter

Salt and white pepper

Sweat ingredients until clear.

80ml milk and 60ml cream

Deglaze with the milk and cream, cover and let simmer on medium heat for 10 minutes. Remove the lid and reduce the liquid to a syrupy consistency. Process to a smooth puree

CUCUMBER, APPLE, MELON

Make 20 scoops of each of the three ingredients using a melon baller with a 10mm diameter. You will need 5 of each per person.

GARNISH (SPLIT EVENLY AMONG 4 PLATES)

16 slices of Thai green chili

4 x 1/2 tsp. of finely diced lemongrass

4 split hearts of butterhead lettuce


4 tbsp. pink pickled ginger cut into round slices



for example, came about while location scouting in Rügen, an island in Germany. The goal was to take advantage of the atmosphere of the winding-down GDR era. A monument in front of a Russian barracks gave me the idea; the inscription became my title. The times on the clocks are the proof of invented authenticity. I rewrite my characters' stories.



To me, they are about the realization of my fantasies, which I do not necessarily need to experience in real life. Like Helmut Newton, I enter a parallel world through my pictures. A tribute to a woman becomes poetry to me and escapes from the realm of physical desire. Nevertheless, a new kind of ownership arose through the collaborative creation of the piece. My counterpart would become an important part of my life.

Where do you find your ideas?

On eBay or spontaneously in a conversation. A 'sideways' reading of eBay reveals a realm that leads to worlds of desire we have never even dreamed of before. Every used object has a story. I soak that up. It can also be a 'normal,' everyday situation, like a train or a restaurant, in which an instantly implementable idea strikes.

What should the viewer discover in your works?

Viewers should be inspired to escape into their own imaginations and discover new longings. There must always be room to keep dreaming.



Art emits grandiose, utopianist notions that conquer reality bit by bit. It constantly plays with the limits of possibility and questions the world as we know it. In doing this, animals play a helpful part. They move nimbly on the often narrow divides between nature and culture or wilderness and civilization. As the photogenic intermediaries between these worlds, they play a stylistic, and even purpose-giving, role: guiding people to self-discovery.

A lion on the ledge of a New York skyscraper seems like a magnificent flight of fancy. But photography would not be photography if it did not execute this fictional overstepping of boundaries as precisely as possible. Hamburg-based photographer **Tom Nagy** placed various wild animals in urban settings to show how close we might sometimes be to what seems so far removed. In his pictures, the two thrilling spheres enter a dialog, and the impossible becomes possible. It

is astonishing how the powerful and lithe king of the savannah fits in among the lofty air of the towering buildings in New York.

The worlds created by **Robert Jahns** are somewhat quieter, but equally phenomenal. He seeks out moments of great emotional enchantment, layering two separate worlds to produce one. A whale swimming with her calf in the Venetian Lagoon is more than a romantic concept for an image. In this magnificent vision, there is a tremendous, concealed power that extends far beyond the reaches of possibility and existence.

The quirky, narrative images by **Federico Naef** address our senses in a different way. In his *Eat Me* series, a specific can of spaghetti and meatballs plays a major role. On a trip through the Namibian desert, Naef found one such can at a remote gas station. It inspired his series of images with a retro

look. The story of an unruly poodle being forced – at gunpoint, no less – to consume the aforementioned spaghetti comes across like an exquisite new version of New York family traditions from the Corleone household.

What looks like an artificial set in **Ramona Waldner's** artwork is actually pure nature. In 2014, the photographer received an assignment to photograph the world's most beautiful cattle

breeds in their natural habitats. For her portraits of these impressive beasts, she climbed to hard-to-reach mountain pastures and traveled to distant countries and regions. The millennia-old connection between people and bovines is shown in a captivating way. The animals prove themselves to be beautiful and graceful creatures with very individual features and admirable characteristics.







Whether photographers take a traditional, atmospheric, distorted, or monochromatic approach, the way they choose to depict nature can fill it with new life and throw a spotlight on it in an intoxicating way.

Daniel Reiter concentrates on one of the natural elements: water. Specifically in the form of waves. Every one of his wave pictures has an individual essence. By combining three phases of a wave into an extraordinary triptych, Reiter creates a moving and profound composite. In a piece full of contrasts, we see a period of time and the changing state of the wave throughout it.

Sabine Wild's new *City Green* series addresses the relationship between nature and the city. In the Berlin-based artist's characteristic style, interwoven and visually clear elements collide in an abundance of contrasts. In this series, a departure from her usual city pictures, nature and urban space form a new stylistic connection. Forest and city become one, layering themselves and permeating each other until they can no longer be clearly separated.


There is a very unusual relationship between the colors in **Barry Cawston's** photograph of a snowy tree that is still
